Partnership for Climate Finance and Development

OBJECTIVES OF THE PARTNERSHIP

COUNTRY LEVEL:

- Channel climate finance using countries' existing planning, budgeting and public financial management systems
- Developing country supporters will have stronger country-level capacities to effectively manage climate finance.

REGIONAL LEVEL:

- Share knowledge on managing climate finance through regional platforms in and across regions
- Developing country supporters and other development co-operation providers will identify and share lessons and best practices in managing climate finance.

GLOBAL LEVEL:

- Share progress of the Partnership across the relevant international policy processes and communities
- Development co-operation providers, international organisations and civil society supporters will pursue coherent approaches in delivering international climate finance based on the common principles of development effectiveness and experience in partner countries.

Governments in partner countries work together to develop in-country capacity to effectively manage and deliver climate finance, with the collective support from climate finance and development co-operation providers as well as from civil society stakeholders. These in-country approaches and experiences are shared with countries at the regional and global levels, and supported by the Partnership.
